#### **Assessing Our Jewish Life**

# Israeli Holidays – a Spring of Remembrance and Celebration

Even as Passover rules the Jewish spring calendar, Israeli Civic Holidays stand out this April.

Holocaust Memorial Day – Yom HaShoah, Israeli Memorial Day – Yom Ha-Zikaron, and Israeli Independence Day – Yom Ha-Atzma'ut, come in quick succession in the weeks following Passover.

Yom HaShoah occurs on the 27<sup>th</sup> of Nisan, this year on Thursday, April 12. It is chosen to fall a week after Passover and eight days before Israeli Independence Day.

In Israel, the day starts with the sounding of an air raid siren over the entire country. Wherever people are they stop and stand for the entirety of the three minutes that the klaxon sounds. All traffic on the roads stops, and Israelis get out of their cars, even in the middle of the highway and stand at attention. This is one of the most profound and dramatic civic and national observances I have ever witnessed – worth scheduling a trip to Israel during this day in the spring.

This April in Buffalo we commemorate Yom HaShoah with a community gathering on Sunday, April 15, at 11:30 a.m. at Congregation Shir Shalom.

Yom Ha-Zikaron and Yom Ha-Atzma'ut deliberately occur one after the other and are oriented around the day when Israel declared independence on May 14, 1948 - 4 Iyar on the Hebrew calendar - and falls on Thursday, April 19, this year. Before celebrating the independence of their country, Israelis make sure to honor and remember all those who have died so that the Jewish State could exist. After a solemn day of cemetery visits and memorial gatherings – everyone in Israel has family or friends who died in the military or in a terrorist attack – the entire nation changes mood at sundown for an evening of revelry.

We celebrate Israel's Seventieth Year this April, a milestone occasion, and the Buffalo Jewish community will have a week of great events. See page 10 for all the events and information.

Join me at all of these events as we mourn our losses, commemorate our heroic history and celebrate our Homeland together.

Each member will be given time to address the Board, with additional time for questions by the trustees.

Board meetings generally occur once a month and are always posted on the Temple calendar at tbz.org.

We welcome each question and each discussion because it shows that you are interested, concerned and want to do more. It is important to hear from you.

We welcome everyone's continued participation in the coming months in strengthening our shared future.



#### The Roots of Grassroots Gardens

You may have noticed the sign that was quietly installed near the large pine tree to overlook the garden on the Barker Street side of the Sanctuary at 805 Delaware. It was the finishing touch to the Grassroots Garden planted by Jewish Family Service several years ago as a garden of peace and growth for the refugees in Buffalo.



What many may not know is that Grassroots Gardens of WNY, Temple Beth Zion and Jewish Family Service are interconnected, not just through this one garden but through the legacy of Milton Zeckhauser, founder of Grassroots Gardens, Temple Beth Zion Trustee and President of Jewish Family Service.

"Zeke," as his family and close friends called him, got the original idea for the Grassroots Garden program when he saw a program on CBS's "60 Minutes" about a community garden in Philadelphia. He knew it could work in Buffalo and was determined to bring the idea to the area, as he saw it as an opportunity to grow people and neighborhoods, not just plants and vegetables.

Using his vast network of contacts throughout the city to select the board of his new agency, he sought "likeminded" individuals, those who had a love of gardening and a desire to improve the city. He went to see his friend Tony Masiello, at the time Mayor of Buffalo, as he knew that some of the city's 300 vacant lots would be perfect to plant the seeds of the idea for community gardens.

It was an opportunity not just about the hardy dirt for the garden but cleaning up the lots, the earth and eventually helping the people of the neighborhoods. Focusing on the East Side in the very depressed areas, he found someone who would oversee the garden, select the lot and organize the neighborhood.

Grassroots Gardens would supply the materials, the know-how and the infrastructure. Zeke's focus was that the "gardens were growing the people as well as the vegetables." As the plant seeds took root, so did the social network of the neighbors. Neighborhoods were turned around.

His family and Buffalo lost Zeke in 2006, when he passed at 96 years of age. His wife, Amy, is incredibly touched by the garden at TBZ and all those across the area as she remembers Zeke being so worried that the project would die with him. The Temple Beth Zion family is honored to be able to continue the legacy in partnership with JFS.




