### Letter from the President

In order for our temple to not just survive, but thrive, it is essential that you, the congregants, be engaged and involved. Of course, that means you have to feel a connection to this community. Your board and I are trying to find ways to ensure that all of you feel that connection and hopefully share that desire to be engaged.

A few weeks ago, I received from a congregant an email in which he shared that he had volunteered in a previous email to me to be a part of a committee and how upset he was that I did not respond to that original email. He went on to share how important it is to acknowledge congregants, particularly when they offer to be on a committee.

I completely agreed with his belief in the importance of acknowledging congregants, especially those offering to be more engaged, and was distressed that he felt that I had ignored him. Unfortunately, his first email never made it to me. A search of my various mailboxes, including spam and junk mail, failed to turn up the original email. I promptly responded to our congregant and explained what had happened and invited him to join the committee in which he expressed interest. I was so grateful that he took the time to express his concerns. Had he not, TBZ would have lost the benefit of his enthusiasm and expertise. More importantly, he would have continued to believe that I did not value his offer to get involved.

I want to make it very clear that I value all of your ideas. If you send me an email and I don't respond in two or three days, I did not receive it. Please either try to send another email or call the office and let them know you need me to call you. I am so deeply grateful to our congregant who took the time to reach out to me. Frankly, it would have been easier for him to assume that I was too careless to respond to an email and never again try to be involved. We hope every one of you will give others the benefit of the doubt. We need every one of you to find your place at TBZ to make it the best it can be.

I recently attended a Shabbat service to observe the yahrzeit of my beloved father. The famous Israeli author Amos Oz had just passed away that week. Rabbi Freirich spoke about Oz's remarkable career and shared this quote of his: "Bring a bucket of water and throw it on the fire, and if you don't have a bucket, bring a glass, if you don't have a glass, bring a teaspoon. And yes, I know a teaspoon is little and fire is huge but there are millions of us and each one of us has a teaspoon."

There aren't millions of us, we're about 800 "family units," but together we can do great things.

### **Finding Holiness Through Loss**

Remembering Cantor Susan Wehle z"l



"Penny, when I get back from Costa Rica, let's finally meet to partner in creating a Buffalo adult Jewish choir."

These were the last words Cantor Susan Wehle said to me in the parking lot before she left on her long awaited, much deserved vacation to Costa Rica from which she never returned.

This month our community will commemorate the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the crash of Continental Airlines Flight #3407, which occurred on February 12, 2009.

For those of you who didn't have the good fortune to meet her, Susan was unequivocally the spiritual center of Temple Beth Am (now Congregation Shir Shalom), and the unspoken wisdom she bestowed, leading by example, continues to be a great influence on me. It was by observing her nurturing approach that inspired my cantorate as I've encountered our congregants' many variations of spirituality, Torah, and G-d.

Cantor Susan was and still is the most spiritual person I have ever known. She carried an unassuming spiritual light in those beautiful blue eyes that made you feel immediately at ease, regardless of who you were. Generous of spirit, she would always leave her ego at the door and allow others to shine. She was ever at the ready with a kind and encouraging word, a bit of Torah. And in moments of musical desperation she would sing songs into your answering machine so you could learn them.

At times, how I miss her so - her loss is palpable. She wouldn't want us to lament her untimely passing, she would want us to live. That is where *kedushah* occurs.

Please join the Jewish community on Saturday, February 9, at Congregation Shir Shalom as we pray and commemorate the passengers of Flight #3407.

### **Temple Beth Zion**

**Our Mission Statement** 

Temple Beth Zion is a Reform congregation that enriches Jewish lives, promotes Jewish values, strengthens Jewish bonds and fosters lifelong learning. ### **Update on Refinancing Plan**

A congregational meeting and vote was held on Sunday, January 6, at the Broder Center. During the meeting, TBZ leaders shared the plan to refinance existing debt owed to the Foundation of Jewish Philanthropies, that had been taken out to support remodeling of the Delaware building and Broder Center prior to 2014.

The plan includes obtaining a \$200,000 mortgage secured by the Broder Center that will be paid in monthly installments over the next 10 years. In addition, the Board sought congregational approval to obtain a line of credit up to \$150,000 to be used to support future working capital projects if needed. The membership voted to approve the plan.

Following is a summary of questions and answers asked during the meeting:

Q. Why did the board choose to finance with a 10-year loan versus a 5-year term?

A. The decision to finance the loan with a 10-year term versus a shorter term was so that Temple Beth Zion would be able to manage its annual operating budget. A primary goal was to ensure that TBZ had sufficient funds on an annual basis to pay the principal and interest on this loan, which totals about \$26,000 per year over a 10-year period. There is no prepayment penalty on the loan, so if there are more funds available, the board can choose to pay more on the principal balance, thereby reducing the length of time to pay back the loan and reducing the debt.

Q. Why was this debt incurred with the Foundation? Is this new debt?

A. This debt is not new debt. The debt was owed to the Foundation from previous construction and renovation projects for both the Delaware Avenue and Broder Center facilities, for building upkeep, tenant improvements and repairs to systems. The loans were taken out prior to 2014.

Q. What is the interest rate? How does the rate we are paying on the loan compare to our rate of return on our investments?

A. The interest rate for our mortgage is competitive against other banks. M&T has quoted a rate based on the 10-year cost of funds plus a margin. As with all loans, the exact rate will be set just prior to closing. We expect the rate to be between 6.0 and 6.5%. Leadership carefully evaluated the balance between securing financing at a fixed interest rate and maintaining our investments according to the established investment policy. As future returns cannot be predicted, securing funding at this rate was determined to be a reasonable and conservative approach to maintaining our financial security.



### **Meeting Notes**

The Board met on December 11. The meeting was called to order after the Board of Trustees participated in the Jewish Federation Community Program for the Amiel BaKehila Program, which is an initiative under the auspices of Israel's Ministry of Diaspora Affairs and brings aspects of Israeli culture to select cities in North America.

Treasurer Dave Goldberg and Amy Schaefer provided a report on the first-quarter financial results. The report specified that: Overall, revenues and expenses are within plan and tracking well. Current collections of dues and school tuitions are strong despite lower than expected enrollment in Preschool and Religious School. Utility costs in summer were higher than budgeted due to an increase per unit cost and higher usage. Expenses for outside services, such as paid security services at select events, are being monitored closely. As part of the effort to stabilize TBZ's financial position, about \$120,000 was paid to the Foundation of Jewish Philanthropies to pay off a portion of the existing debt, and the application process to refinance the remaining \$200,000 with a mortgage from M&T Bank is proceeding.

Jody Goldstein, Membership Engagement Chair, provided an update on the successful Chanukah Service, where TBZ welcomed new members. Jody also announced future initiatives, including a Shabbat Dinner Club.

The discussion continued about current and future security measures at 805 Delaware and there was agreement to follow up with the newly formed Security Task Force and Building Task Force which will be conducting assessments in December.


