Letter from the President

On February 26 we began the month of Adar. In "The Happiness of Adar", Rabbi Lawrence A Hoffman explains that, "When Adar begins, the Rabbis say, "We increase happiness." How can our tradition command happiness? There are many reasons to not be happy. There are many reasons to feel sadness. As I am writing this, the world has recently learned of the tragic passing of basketball legend Kobe Bryant, his 13 year-old daughter and seven other souls. My heart is heavy from this and so many other troubles in the world.

Rabbi Hoffman suggests that Adar returns us to the basics. That whatever our current situation, we are "capable of adding to the world's stock of love, compassion, and charity; honor, humor, and wholeness: the things that really matter..."

We have loads of reasons to be happy during the month of Adar with TBZ and the greater Jewish community. Almost every page of this issue highlights opportunities for celebration and fun.

At Purim we are encouraged to dress up in festive costumes. The Torah portion for the first week of March is Parsha Tetzaveh. Much of the parsha describes how the sacred space of the Tabernacle is to be decorated, and what clothing the priests should wear. In, "You Look Marvelous", Rabbi Joe Eiduson (yes, the Joey Eiduson who was one year behind me at TBZ Hebrew School and our Rabbi Educator in the 90's) asked the question, "Why was so much time and space dedicated to the outward, external dress of the High Priests? Why not focus instead on the inward qualities necessary to lead and serve the Children of Israel? The suggestion was that the garments served to remind the Priest that he must make the ideal of holiness the constant guide of his life."

In "High Moral Standards for Our Leaders, and Ourselves", Rabbi Sarah Bassin speaks about the danger of turning people into symbols. "Everyone of us has our own story of a hero who let us down....It takes an emotional toll to have our beloved icons fall and expectations crushed." She urges us to hold fast to our expectations - of our priests, our politicians, our athletes, and, I would add, your TBZ board. It is an honor to be one of the group of dedicated individuals who do the sacred work of taking care of our congregation. This is work that really matters, and while it is often challenging, I believe there is happiness in being a part of something much bigger than myself.

Letter from the Clergy Associate

It's Adar – be happy! Who doesn't love a holiday which commands us to be happy? Purim is coming, with all of its costumes and songs and games and yummy hamantaschen. We're told that we must do four things to celebrate Purim. First, we must tell the story of Queen Esther and how her bravery saved the Jews of Persia. Second, we must send gifts of food to at least one friend or relative because Purim is a time of love and friendship. Contrary to popular opinion, it's Purim, not Chanukah, which is the real gift-giving holiday. The third mitzvah is to give gifts of money to the poor. This act of caring and compassion not only helps those in need but allows them to fulfill the mitzvah of giving *tzedakah*, as well. Finally, we're commanded to eat a festive meal. We're Jews, after all!

The Book of Esther is one of only two books in the Torah in which God is not mentioned. The story of Queen Esther is one of hidden miracles, acts of bravery and the power of one person (and a woman, no less!) to change the world. Far from being a funny story for children, it is a tale that celebrates the strength of human action. The Purim story can also be seen in a more modern context. There are threats of genocide and destruction in many parts of the world today. It's easy to feel powerless and overwhelmed. So it feels good - it feels necessary - to be reminded of Esther's bravery and of her human actions, fueled by faith, in a story where God is concealed. It gives us hope that we too can do our share of Tikkun Olam, the repair of the world. As Margaret Mead, an American anthropologist, once said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed people can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has."

In between, on March 13, our board president, Julie Dressler Weinberg, will lead a storytelling workshop before our Spirituality Shabbat service. And, continuing our ability to get together and enjoy each other's company will be another Shabbat dinner in the home of one of our congregants on March 20, and a Bagel Brunch at Bagel Jay's on March 22. Wow! Such a joyful month!

According to Rabbi Sacks, "There is a unique law in the approach to Purim. Mishe-nichnas Adar marbim be-simcha. "From the beginning of Adar, we increase in joy." It is stated in the Talmud (Taanit 29a), and is based on the passage in the Megillah (Esther 9:21-22) in which Mordechai sends a letter throughout the land instructing Jews "to observe the fourteenth and fifteenth day of the month of Adar, every year - the days on which the Jews obtained rest from their enemies and the month which for them was turned from sorrow into gladness and from mourning into a holiday." That is what we do on Purim. The joy, the merrymaking, the food, the drink, the whole carnival atmosphere, are there to allow us to live with the risks of being a Jew - in the past, and tragically in the present also - without being terrified, traumatized or intimidated. It is the most counter-intuitive response to terror, and the most effective. Terrorists aim to terrify. To be a Jew is to refuse to be terrified. The Jewish way to avoid being intimidated is marbim be-simcha, to increase our joy.

Our community is looking for joy and connection, and this will continue through monthly events. But let's not wait for these events to form connections or to experience joy together. Let's find connection by laughing with others, or sharing a meal, or sharing a ride with those who need one to get to an event.

From the Director

Religious School What does the Director of the Religious School do? As part of their synagogue unit, our 2nd Graders are discovering who works at TBZ and what they do. Their teacher, Jessica Bommer, invited me to speak to her class, which got me thinking... what DO I do here at TBZ?

More than anything, I make sure we have a faculty. We are blessed with dedicated, creative, capable, caring teachers. It is wonderful to visit Religious School classrooms and see the interesting and meaningful activities our teachers present. We are also lucky to have an amazing cohort of high school Madrichim guided very well by Tammy VanWey and Beth Shapiro. It is my job to hire, guide, communicate with, and support our teachers.

Of course, we also need students! I am part of the team that meets with prospective new families to answer their questions and convince them that coming to TBZ's Religious School is in their child's best interest. I also work to make connections with our current parents and students so that everyone here feels welcomed, valued, and heard. A school also needs a curriculum. As Director I decide what topics will be taught at each grade level. With input from the teachers and others, I select the books and other materials that we will use.

I also determine what Specials and other events to include in our curriculum. What activities will benefit our students the most? I recently redesigned our calendar and schedules so that students and teachers can enjoy the most valuable experiences possible here. Figuring out which classes need to do what, where, when, and for how often was like playing an enormous game of Sudoku!

Running our weekly *Tefillah* (prayer service) is another important task. Many families don't attend services very often. But, without regular exposure to and participation in Reform Jewish practice, our children won't grow to understand or appreciate it. I work to make Tefillah joyful and engaging for all of our students, and Zack Steinberg's guitar playing and song-leading adds wonderful *Ruach* (spirit) to the experience!

I spend a lot of my time writing. I write articles like this one for the TBZ Bulletin and the Jewish Journal. To ensure that they are aware of what their children are doing here, I produce a colorful <u>Letter from the Director</u> that is emailed to all parents after each session.

Planning special events is challenging, but exciting. How to present a program for kids from 5 to 13 years old that teaches them about a holiday or a Mitzvah and holds their attention for an hour? By providing engaging activities that appeal to students of different interests and learning styles. See the pics on this page from our Tu B'Shevat Celebration!

As we draw closer to Purim, I think about the *middah* (value) of *simcha* - happiness. In the Jewish tradition, one of the reasons that we celebrate all of the holidays, from Purim to even Thanksgiving, is to experience true happiness.

A wonderful reminder of where we can find *simcha* is in last blessing of *sheva brachot*, which are the seven blessings said during the marriage ceremony. In this final blessing, which is normally sung aloud, we ask G-d to always bless us with "the songs of the youth."

So as our joy is fulfilled through celebrating Purim, and as our happiness is replenished when remembering and practicing the *middah* of *simcha*, I would like to share some tips for finding your daily dose of *simcha* from the preschool perspective:

- 1. Sing any song that makes your heart happy- a current favorite in our classroom is Peace Like A River
- 2. Find pleasure in the process, not only the product. Crafts, projects, etc. do not always turn out as intended, but it's amazing how much you can learn in the process of doing
- 3. Don't be afraid to get messy thank goodness for washing machines! Moments happen once, indulge in them completely, even it if means getting messy in the process.
- 4. Read a good book cuddling up with a loved one and reading a great book is always a wonderful way to bring joy into your life
- 5. **PLAY** give yourself the permission to play! Swing on the swings with your children or grandchildren, play with a beloved pet in the park, go sledding, play a board game! The possibilities are endless.


