In the last year, we have:

- Held dozens of events as our transition team welcomed Rabbi Gutmann and his family to Buffalo
- Worshipped together in our sanctuary during High Holy Day for the first time in three years
- Completed another year as a partner in the Community **Religious School**
- Surpassed our goal in the annual Kol Nidre campaign
- Secured a \$150,000 security grant to further protect our congregation
- Received a \$300,000 grant over three years to begin a program educating area school children about TBZ's history, architecture, and the history of Jews in Buffalo
- Fixed the roof and updated the kitchen at 805 Delaware
- Hosted the first ever Freedom Seder with First Shiloh **Baptist Church**
- Co-hosted the first ever Community 2nd Night Seder with Congregation Shir Shalom
- Hosted Earth Day and community events at 805 Delaware
- Held the Grand Opening for the re-imagined Cofeld Judaic Museum
- · Celebrated with a wonderful weekend of events for the installation of our Senior Rabbi
- Launched a major capital campaign to repair, renovate, and restore our spiritual home at 805 Delaware
- Helped re-settle two refugee families in partnership with Jewish Family Services
- Re-established our committees with engaged members excited to do good work
- Led by example with board members serving as chairs of at least one initiative
- Continued to participate in the community's LIFE & LEGACY[®] program

Letter from the Rabbi

Acquire for Yourself a Friend

Thank you, thank you, thank you for the wonderful Rabbinic Installation celebration last month. It was a beautiful event and we all know now that Temple Beth Zion still knows how to party! My family and I feel deeply blessed to be here and we pray that you feel blessed that we are here as well.

Rabbi Joshua ben Perahiah teaches in Pirkei Avot, the oldest source of rabbinic wisdom, "Appoint for thyself a rabbi, and acquire for thyself a friend." (Pirkei Avot 1:6)

At the completion of my first full year at Temple Beth Zion, I feel your appreciation. You are loving and caring. You are deeply invested in temple's success and you have offered your friendship.

On the deepest level, a rabbi is a teacher. So, too, our tradition emphasizes learning among the most fundamental human needs. Even after fifteen consecutive years serving congregations, I recognize that I still have so much to learn and I am grateful for your willingness to be on this journey of growth and learning with me.

Temple Beth Zion has an esteemed 174 year history. We are among the oldest Jewish congregations in the country. We pioneered what it meant to be a synagogue in the American context as charter members of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Our members have led inside and outside the Jewish world and, throughout this time, we have never stopped learning and growing.

Today, change is as ubiquitous as it has ever been. The ways we pray, learn, and gather are all in flux. Ten years ago, Rabbi Ron Wolfson published "Relational Judaism: Using the Power of Relationships to Transform the Jewish Community." In it he writes, "It's not about programs. It's not about marketing. It's not about branding, labels, logos, clever titles, websites, or smartphone apps. It's not even about institutions. *It's about relationships*," and he argued that those communities with the strongest relationships will be most likely to thrive in this new era.

Part of what has impressed me the most about Temple Beth Zion has been how deep your relationships go. Within moments of announcing I would be moving to Buffalo to become your senior rabbi last year, no fewer than three of my former congregants shared genuine love stories about TBZ. Within moments, no fewer than three of my mother's friends shared love stories about TBZ with her. Only a very special congregation would remain with those who moved



Sisterhood started out this year with a wonderful outdoor Opening Luncheon where about 100 women met our new Rabbi Brent Gutmann and his wife, Jill. At that luncheon the ladies also gave generously to one of our favorite charities, Haven House. Later in the Summer, the Sisterhood Board sponsored a welcome dinner for the Gutmann Family at the home of Lynn and Bobby Klein. In the Fall, Sisterhood coordinated efforts to decorate both the downtown Sukkah and the one at Broder. In mid-October many of our members participated in the Making Strides for Breast Cancer Walk. In November we held our "Games Galore" card party. December brought our successful Chanukah Bazaar, and almost our Family Chanukah Party. Unfortunately, Mother Nature had other ideas! In January we, with Brotherhood, had a wonderful Havdalah evening with lots of food and Bingo! In March, we prepared and served the dinner for the Purim celebration.
