Letter from the Cantor

### A Quarter of My Life Serving TBZ

I struggle as I write this, as the emotion is so deeply overwhelming. However, parameters of editing/word count are keeping me grounded, lest I take off on a tangent as I typically do.

I am deeply humbled to be one of your spiritual leaders and have never taken my position at Temple Beth Zion for granted. When I was hired, I was the first non-ordained/ invested clergy person to help lead TBZ. It was difficult, we endured growing pains - yet you all embraced me and my family with nothing but support and love. Furthermore, you have been the cheerleaders as I traveled my own journey that eventually led to my investiture as Cantor.

### Together We Are TBZ: Volunteer Spotlight

Larry Scheur - Sound Engineer

Do you want to make a difference in the TBZ family? Do you have a special skill that you know could help?

As a sound engineer by training, Larry Scheur knew he could improve on the sound experience at Temple Beth Zion, so he volunteered to help.



When you are next at TBZ take a moment to listen to the service, really listen. You can clearly hear the words and voices of the clergy. No matter where you sit, the sound is reinforced so you can hear enunciation and inflection, but it never sounds like you are listening to speakers. You feel like you are hearing "live" sound. Larry has

been working for years to perfect our system.

With his expertise, Larry has configured systems specific to each space. For example, in the Sanctuary he found a tapdancing floor mic was the best solution to amplify voices of B'nai Mitzvah kids at the lectern without the anxiety of learning to use a microphone in addition to learning to read the Torah. The floor mic picks up their voice clearly as they turn their head and read. Without any effort on their part, we can all hear them shine!

Sound engineering is especially important when people might have issues with hearing. Larry saw a need and donated the hearing assist system in use at Broder and the Sisterhood Chapel. He also worked to update the system in the Sanctuary. It has made a huge difference for many of our members.

Expert volunteers like Larry are indispensable. Do you have a special skill or expertise? Consider volunteering, after all we are TBZ; when we all help, we all benefit. We would love to connect with TBZ-ers with expertise or interest in gardening, landscaping and grounds, facilities design and architecture, and fundraising. These are just a few things we have in mind, but what do you have in mind? What do you want to offer?

### **Temple Beth Zion Memories**

This year, we mark the 50th anniversary of Temple Beth Zion's 805 Delaware Avenue Sanctuary and building. The Sanctuary, Sisterhood Chapel and Dr. Joseph L. Fink Auditorium were designed by New York City architect Max Abramovitz, who was better known for his industrial, commercial and military buildings. Yet the creation of a synagogue was a long-held dream for Abramovitz. While he designed several chapels, most notably the three chapels at Brandeis University and the Jewish Chapel at West Point, Temple Beth Zion was the only synagogue he ever created. ### **`Trembling Before G-d'**

On Thursday, February 23, at 6:30 p.m. in the Broder Center, 700 Sweet Home Road, Kulanu and Jewish Pride of WNY will present a screening of "Trembling Before G-d." This 2001 film, directed by Sandi Simcha DuBowski, is a documentary that intimately tells personal stories of gay and lesbian Hasidic and Orthodox Jews, and their efforts to reconcile their sexuality and their religious beliefs. The film is structured as interviews with gay and lesbian Jews, and also with heterosexual rabbis and psychologists.

"Trembling Before G-d" broke Film Forum's opening-day box office records at the time, grossing more than \$5,500 on the first day of release, and received positive reviews. The film has won numerous awards, including a Gold Plaque at the Chicago International Film Festival in 2001 and a Teddy Award for Best Film at the Berlin International Film Festival in 2002. The film will be followed by a discussion led by Rabbi Jonathan Freirich of Temple Beth Zion.

The event is free, and the entire community is welcome.
