Mitzvah Tools will enable our families and clergy to stay easily connected and have access to audio and video supplements for prayers, blessings, Torah and Haftarah portions. Our families will be able to check their child's progress at any time throughout their students' studies as they travel on their Bar or Bat Mitzvah journey at TBZ.

Using *Mitzvah Tools* will allow all of us to become more efficient during the B'nei Mitzvah process by working smarter, not harder, thus creating a more meaningful experience. Most important, *Mitzvah Tools* will be able to help supplement weekly appointments by allowing remote access learning for our students at any time, day or night.

*Mitzvah Tools* can be viewed on any device with internet access - iPhone, Android phone, iPad, tablet, laptop or desktop. Students and their parents will have instant access to study resources and information for B'nei Mitzvah.

Temple Beth Zion is very proud to be the first Congregation in Buffalo to utilize this cloud-based application. We believe this new connection between families and clergy will facilitate and enhance this special moment in our families' Jewish journey.

We have the website in place and look forward to contacting B'nei Mitzvah families with instructions.

## **Annual Meeting Summary, Our Year in Review**

On June 9, we held our 167<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting. Following are highlights from the President's and Treasurer's Report.

### President's Report

Our Annual Meeting is an opportunity for us to gather and celebrate what we have shared together this year, and it's an opportunity to rededicate and refocus ourselves for the future. We have much to be positive about.

Since last July we have:

- \*Welcomed 30 new families to our TBZ family.
- \*Seen seven of our 10<sup>th</sup> graders reaffirm their commitment to their Jewish education and identities through Confirmation and four TBZ students graduated from Hebrew High.
- \*Shared the pride and happiness as 27 young teens became "Jewish Adults" during their B'nei Mitzvah.
- \*Schmoozed and worshipped as one on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays during Religious School.
- \*Cared for each other in sickness, sadness and said goodbye to close friends and members of our TBZ family.
- \*Welcomed Anat Hoffman who inspired us as part of the clergy installation and Halpern Weekend.
- \*Come together with our community neighbors and partners in solidarity rallies across WNY.
- \*Commemorated the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of our Sanctuary.

Many of those who were here in 1967 have already shared their memories...As each story was told, there is a common thread – TBZ is the home. The place full of emotion and depth, where friendships were made and grew strong.

TBZ and 805 Delaware are not just the walls, floors and ceilings. There is an energy within the walls, TBZ is alive because of us – our relationships and the dedication we have to each other and the community.

As we find ourselves in the year 5777 (or 2017) our lives today are different. Our society and our culture have changed. Our synagogues are not the only place we can socialize. Our lives are busier. We are stretched thin. We are on the go more, whether it is because of our own lives, those of our kids or the lives of our grandkids.

But this is why we must change. Our traditions will remain, but we must be open to engaging differently than we have before. We must stand together with our community partners.

Technology can bring us together. Our new system to make services more accessible through the use of visual t'fillah and live streaming has been up and running on a trial basis since April, so we are able to reach our members beyond our walls. We look forward to building a regular schedule for streamed services and expanding our reach.

This would not be possible, however, without the support of several individuals, specifically:

We also thank both the Sisterhood and Brotherhood for their ongoing support to enable the live streaming.

Looking forward to our shared future, we have much to be positive about. We continue to live and expand our mission and vision to support our Jewish values and engage and connect with each other in ways that are meaningful to us.

As we move to our next fiscal year with an eye on 5778 we see new opportunities, including:

- 1. Continuing to focus on our TBZ families and the WNY community.
- 2. New opportunity with PALS through a new community partnership with Kadimah.
- 3. Enhancement to the B'nei Mitzvah process.
- 4. Expanding informal adult learning opportunity.
- 5. Continue Jewish Spirituality Center programming.

This year we have seen a growth in new members. Our new families come to us in all shapes and sizes, and we will continue to focus on building participation, engagement and connections with each of us. As part of our Congregation continues to age, we find it harder to offset our lost households with new members.

We are 825 families strong – this is our TBZ. Yet our change in membership leads us to continue to improve how we do things, to engage differently and to ensure we are operating as efficiently as we can.


### Treasurer's Report

The Congregation approved the proposed balanced operating budget of \$1,598,302 (a 2.9% reduction from the 2016-17 fiscal year).

On the revenue side, membership dues and contributions are critical aspects and account for just over 50% of revenue. The financial commitments each of us makes are critical to the financial health of our institution, as they enable the clergy and staff to meet the needs of our TBZ families.

The 2017-18 budget includes no automatic dues increase in membership assessments. It is important that each of us continues to honor the membership commitments that have been made. Please consider, if you are able, to voluntarily increase your commitment.

Revenue, such as rental income from our tenants, continues to support our physical spaces.




We are looking at new ways of raising money through additional fundraising events and opportunities with the expectation that dollars will be raised through various events that are social, fun and appealing to the wide community.

On the expense side, our personnel costs account for the majority of our expenses. These funds go directly to support our TBZ mission, values and families, giving us:

- Clergy support during lifecycle events, worship, our individual interactions, festivals and holidays.
- Our teachers for Religious School and PALS.
- Continued upkeep and care of our facilities.
- Organizational support for our families.

We continue to diligently manage our expenses. The Financial Planning Committee, Board of Trustees, Amy Schaefer and the Clergy will continue to look long-term to increase financial stability.



### **Congregational Vote**

In addition to the budget, the congregation voted to approve the recommendations to:

1. Ratify a new contract for Rabbi Scheldt with revised terms for the remaining contract term, until June 30, 2018. Under these new terms, Rabbi Scheldt will have similar rabbinic duties serving the congregational needs only on a reduced schedule so that he is able to achieve a better work/life balance. This new contract was

developed working closely with Rabbi Scheldt and the Board of Trustees and staff so that Rabbi Scheldt has the flexibility needed while ensuring that the needs of our TBZ family are also met.

2. Elected the following to the Board of Trustees: Toby Laping, Todd Shatkin and David Goldberg were elected for 3-year terms (June 2017-June 2020). Kenneth Graber and Susan Bruckheimer will continue to represent Brotherhood and Sisterhood. With her election as President of TBaZY, Madeleine Weinmann will fill the TBaZY seat on the Board.

Prior to adjourning the meeting, we thanked the TBZ administrative and maintenance staff. The value of the contribution of the TBZ office and maintenance staff is beyond words. Without the dedication and hard work of each person, we could not be here.

We especially thanked the staff members who are celebrating a special "milestone" anniversary, including:

- Ed Feldman and Julie Feldman for 20 years of service
- Ann Marie Randall and Nick Gill for 10 years of service

We also took a final opportunity to say thank you to Susan Goldberg Schwartz for her 16 years of service and wish her good luck with her new position at the Bureau of Jewish Education.

## **Temple Beth Zion Memories**



Ben Shahn's artistry found sublime expression in both of his art windows and the calligraphy adorning the Bimah tablets on either side of the ark. But his creative endeavors did not stop there. The Menorah anchored to the Bimah was also designed by Ben Shahn, and its form and content evolved over time.

Just as technical challenges arose with erecting the art glass expanse of the windows, the Menorah itself also posed surprising difficulties because

of its free-form design. Made of polyester over a wroughtiron skeleton flown with 23-karat gold leaf, the early Menorah design was actually based on an original form that was carved in wood.

Initially the design was to be a metal frame filled with small pieces of colored glass, but this eventually evolved into the organic free-form rose-colored shabbat candelabra we see today. Standing on the Bimah like the Menorah in Solomon's Temple, Ben Shahn's final form repeats the design around the mosaic lettering of the tablets, creating a unifying artistic and spiritual presence.


