We call the Jewish fall season of holidays many names. I like the term "the Days of Awe," harking back to times when the word "awesome" meant "causing awe or terror, inspiring wonder or excitement."

In recent months, we may have discovered more reasons for concerns: worries about who we are as Buffalonians and Americans, worries about the safety, security, and longevity, of both our Jewish communities, here and the world over. I could use a bit more wonder and excitement, in place of anxious worry.

For a bit of wonder, please join our reinvigorated Holy Rollers us as we unroll and maintain our 13 "sifrei Torah" – the Torah scrolls in our arks in the Sanctuary, the Sisterhood Chapel and the Social Hall at Broder in Amherst. We have a number of upcoming maintenance sessions, so please contact me directly (836-6565, Ext. 138 or rabbifreirich@tbz.org) to find out the schedule of upcoming events. Attending to the presence of these beautiful handwritten scrolls is a unique experience filled with awe.

Our many worship opportunities often help us move from our anxieties into hope and wonder. With the grandeur of the High Holy Day music, the beautiful liturgy of our new prayer books, and the profound thoughts and reflections generated by these together, I hope that our Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur experiences offer many entries into unique transformational moments.

In August, we began a "Together at the Table" conversation, and in September we have a lunch and learn about "God and the Big Bang," Daniel Matt's intriguing exploration of the intersections between science, religion, and ethical living. These dynamic discussions give everyone the chance to participate and learn from one another, and will continue in the New Year. 



Searching TBZ Library Remotely

Are you looking for a book with a local connection? Do you want to find out more about Jewish spirituality? Do you want to learn more about LGBTQ Jews? Does your prereader want to know if there are any books about Jewish bears? The Temple Beth Zion Library includes books that provide all of this information and more, and you can identify those titles from the comfort of your home or mobile device if you have an Internet connection.

The Temple Library's webpage can be accessed directly from a link at the bottom of the Temple's Adult Education webpage (http://www.tbz.org/education/adult-education/). Once on the Library's webpage, click the Catalog tab. There you will find a drop-down menu that includes "Visual Search" and "Categories."

The Categories item includes "Buffalo Connections," "Meditation," Mindfulness" and "Kulanu," each of which leads to lists of titles. Did you know that you can read a number of memoirs of Gerda Weissmann Klein? Did you know that Cantor Irwin Gelman's father, Charles, fought in the Jewish resistance in Poland – and we have his autobiography? Did you know that two women who left Germany for England in the 1940s ultimately settled in Buffalo - and wrote books about their lives? The library has 24 titles on spirituality, including 14 books on meditation. We also own 14 titles relating to LGBTQ issues. And we have 23 Jewish cookbooks, including TBZ Sisterhood's own Measure for Pleasure, volumes 1 and 2.

Click on the Visual Search item and you will find pictures of topics of interest to our youngest members, including "Animals." The "Animals" tab includes pictures of insects, pets, horses and others. Each picture leads to lists of titles your child or grandchild can ask you to read to him or her.

Take a look at our offerings – and next time you are at the Broder Center, check out your TBZ Library.






