My Jewish Journey

I am overwhelmed with the honor of being elected President of Temple Beth Zion. In my wildest dreams, I never imagined this. Because there are many of you I do not know (which I hope and expect will change during the next two years), I wanted to introduce myself and my Jewish journey that brought me to this space.

My family roots at TBZ go back to the late 1800s. My maternal great-grandmother (who lived to 99) was confirmed here. I still have my Torah from consecration and had my Bar Mitzvah at the Temple Beth El building on Richmond Ave following the terrible fire that decimated our old building at 599 Delaware in 1961. Religious School was at the Jewish Center. Rabbis Fink and Goldberg presided at my Bar Mitzvah. My parents Harold and Janet, may they rest in peace, loved Temple Beth Zion second only to our family. They would be so proud to see me as President.

I owe so much to my parents. We worked together in our family business — Dad really until his death. They taught me values that guide me every day still: honesty, ethics and hard work. At Dad's funeral I relayed a story that speaks volumes: A salesman from whom we bought most of our merchandise pulled me aside when I was maybe 20. He said, "Your father is my ONLY customer who tells me not only when I send too few of something by mistake—but also when I send too many." What a wonderful story to hear about a parent—and a positive life lesson.

Dad also taught me to volunteer — don't complain about something if you're not willing to try to make it better. Which I believe is how I arrived at this moment. My hope is to help make this great institution even better. When I was confirmed, there were 118 of us in the class. While we aren't likely to see those numbers again, I have hopes and goals and look forward to working with many of you, our tireless staff and incredible clergy team to make us the best we can be.

Thank you for this tremendous honor. I promise I will do my very best to appropriately follow the legacy of Immediate Past President Ken Rogers and all his predecessors who served this congregation with honor and distinction before me.

Letter from the Rabbi

A Time of Transition

August is a time of preparing. Sales for school supplies begin (it is, after all, National Back to School Month). Harvests from vegetable gardens are often underway (and don't forget to gather seeds for next year!). And those of us in the Jewish world are already hard at work preparing for the High Holy Days. Indeed, August is a time of transition. It is a month that still allows us to enjoy many of the fruits of summer, but also calls upon us to prepare for the ever-approaching autumn.

In our preparations and our transitions there is always a mix of emotion. To be sure, there is some stress and anxiety around getting prepared for the school year—there is always so much to do! And especially here in Buffalo, it is never pleasant to think about bidding farewell to warm weather. But it is also a time to anticipate new beginnings and fresh starts. Next month, we will honor and celebrate our High Holy Days that directly offer our spiritual selves and our communal self the opportunity to renew and refresh. This month, however, as we prepare and transition, we have the opportunity to renew and refresh in a different way—by making the world a better place.




PALS help Rabbi Scheldt select the perfect spot for planting tomatoes in the tzedakah corner of the Outdoor Classroom.

Please note: While we will continue to have our Rosh Hashanah Children's Service at 9 a.m. at Delaware, there will be no Rosh Hashanah Alternate Service at 9 a.m. at Delaware, only at Becker Farms. Our regular Rosh Hashanah Morning Service will now begin at 10:30, rather than 11:30.

Ticket Information

All High Holy Day tickets will automatically be mailed by the end of August to everyone whose Temple support is paid in full for the year ended June 30 (as well as for all prior years) and who have returned the 2014-2015 Support Payment form with the appropriate payment.

If your support is current and you do not receive a ticket by September 8, please call the office. If you still owe a balance on your dues, you may pay it by mail with a check, or phone Ed Feldman at 836-6565, Ext. 133, with your credit card. Your ticket will be mailed after your support is paid. If you are unable to pay your support in full before the High Holy Days, or if you have any other questions about ticket policies, phone Mark Criden, Executive Director, at 836-6565, Ext. 135.

Be sure to bring your ticket to each service you attend. Admittance to the regular services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur is by ticket only. Children younger than 24 do not need tickets. College students need only show their ID cards.

B'nai Mitzvah of the Month: Buffalo Stormwater Medallions

In getting ready for his Bar Mitzvah, Oren Forgette read *The Mitzvah Project Book: Making Mitzvah Part of Your Bar/Bat Mitzvah and Your Life* by Liz Suneby & Diane Heiman. One of the mitzvah projects was "Be a Water Watchdog." It made him think about what happens to old motor oil, paint, garden fertilizer and



swimming pool chemicals, and that too often they end up washed or poured down drains. Without realizing it, people's household chemicals are flowing into Scajaquada Creek, the Niagara River, Lake Ontario and finally the Atlantic Ocean, polluting the water and hurting wildlife. Oren realized that because many people were unaware of the links between household chemicals and water pollution, education was key.



On Sunday, May 4, Oren led his Boy Scout Troop 5 in installing Stormwater Medallions on Windsor, Clarendon, Claremont and Parkdale avenues in the City of Buffalo. The purpose was to get the word out concerning the links between household chemicals and water pollution. The round blue

discs, or medallions, that they attached to the tops of storm drains will help remind and educate Buffalonians who live within the Combined Sewer Overflow #060 sewershed about the importance of preventing pollution from entering our sensitive waterways and, above all, to remember "do not dump wastes" each time you look at the medallions.

Prior to the installation of the medallions, Oren also created and distributed fliers to educate and inform the community about opportunities to compost, participate in hazardous waste collection and a reminder to reduce, reuse and recycle.

TGIS!... Thank God It's Shabbat!

TGIS! is our Shabbat Attendance program for all PreK – 7th grade students enrolled in our Religious School. Attending Shabbat services on a regular basis helps your child become comfortable at services, understand the Hebrew that he or she is learning and gain proficiency in its usage, all while celebrating the joys of Shabbat with your TBZ family.



Every time a child attends a Shabbat Service at TBZ during the school year, they can see one of the clergy following services to say Shabbat Shalom and receive a sticker for their attendance card. All students who attend at least five Shabbat services during the upcoming year will receive special recognition at the end of the school year.




