### August Means Elul

Elul, the month that leads up to Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, means celebration and reflection.

This month, in addition to a BBQ Shabbat at Broder (August 3), our Annual Summer Celebration (August 6), a big Sisterhood Event (August 27), the Buffalo Jewbilee and the Cantor's Chai 5K Walk/Run (August 19), and four B'nei Mitzvah celebrations, we will have our regular Elul Series of services with special music to lift our spirits and a special theme, "There Is No 'Us and Them,'" to spur thought and action as we head toward the Jewish New Year.

Rabbi Greenberg and his lovely wife, Lea, were sent to Buffalo to be Shlichim (emissaries) of the Lubavitcher Rebbe Menachem Mendel Shneerson in 1972. They have worked tirelessly ever since to reach out to members of the Jewish community. Many TBZ members have attended classes taught by Rabbi Greenberg at the Jewish Discovery Center; some have brought their toddlers to “Music with Miss Rivky”; still others have attended classes led by members of Rabbi Greenberg’s extended family.

Over the last several years, I’ve attended classes at the JDC and celebrated Shabbat at the Greenbergs’ home. They are lovely people. While their form of Judaism is different from mine, I have found that my commitment to Reform Judaism has only been strengthened through my increased understanding of Chassidus. What we have in common is so much more important than what divides us. I hope you will mark your calendars and join us on August 12.

I took a break from working on this article to hard-boil eggs for the shiva of the father of someone very dear to me. The woman coordinating the shiva meals is a TBZ member. The chain of texts went to members of TBZ, Shir Shalom, Temple Beth Tzedek, the JDC, and others who are unaffiliated. Our little group is a perfect microcosm of Jewish Buffalo. We are connected by love and grief for our friend.

This is my experience of Jewish Buffalo. We are as different as snowflakes, but what binds us together is so much more important. I look forward to sharing many special moments with you in the coming months.

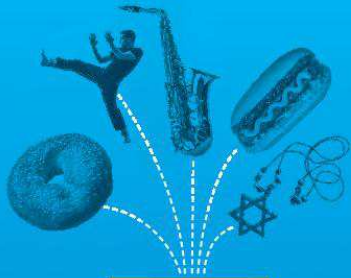

## An Exciting Religious School Year

We are eagerly anticipating the upcoming school year. TBZ Religious School may be off for the summer, but we use this time for cleaning, reflecting, planning and preparing for the next school year.

Our mission is to create a loving and caring learning environment where our students and families:

- ★ Grow a love for Judaism, their Jewish community and the world in which we live - *Avhava* (love)
- ★ Learn Jewish traditions and blessings - *Torah* (learning)
- ★ Develop a deep bond to our Jewish history and to Jews everywhere - *Israel* (people & land)

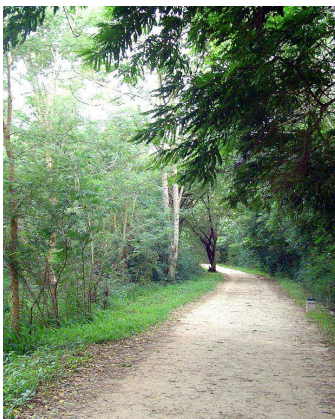

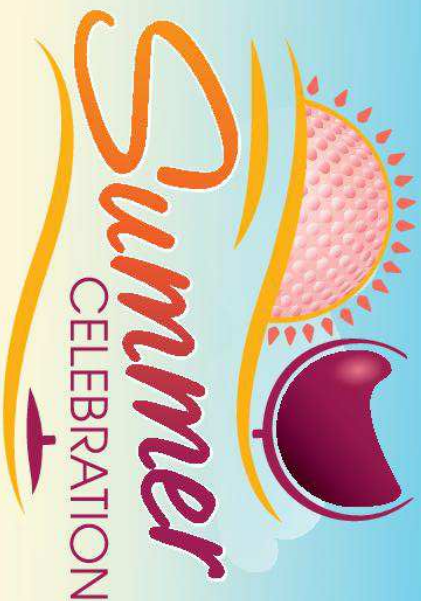
