*Letter from the Rabbi*

**Gathering Strength**

Author Priya Parker asks why we gather in her 2020 book, The Art of Gathering, and concludes, “We gather to solve problems we can’t solve on our own. We gather to celebrate, to mourn, and to mark transitions. We gather to make decisions. We gather because we need one another. We gather to show strength. We gather to honor and acknowledge. We gather to build companies and schools and neighborhoods...” (p. 113)

Beginning with my arrival two years ago I pointed out the linguistic connection between the words ‘congregation’ and ‘congregate’ as well as the word ‘synagogue’ and its Greek etymological root ‘sunagōgē,’ meaning ‘meeting,’ to encourage you to show up for Temple Beth Zion. I shared my intention to devote myself to the spiritual needs of TBZ, but said that it would take all of us coming together to bring temple back to life. Two years later there are many signs of a transformation underway.

New religious, programmatic and cultural offerings are drawing hundreds every month, including a significant following of young families. Our members’ generosity has helped us raise over \$6M towards a \$12.8M Capital Campaign to complete renovations at our historic 805 Delaware building while creating an endowment to ensure its future preservation.

One major milestone as we restore TBZ to health comes this month with the arrival of Cantor Susan Lewis-Friedman and her family to Buffalo. Those of you who have already met Cantor Susie will have recognized her exceptional talent and charismatic warmth. For those of you who have not yet met her, there will be many opportunities in the coming months, including the Cantor’s welcome weekend July 5 and 6. You can also reach out via email to welcome her at [cantorsusie@tbz.org](mailto:cantorsusie@tbz.org).

As we continue to gather, our third year together is sure to be as momentous as the first two, with significant milestone celebrations to come. Please save the date as Cantor Susie will be installed by Cantor David Goldstein the weekend of November 1 - 2, and stay alert for more information on the temple’s spring gala commemorating 175 years since TBZ’s founding.

You have come out in support of temple, and temple has grown stronger. All of us have relished what we have created so far by gathering together. Two years in, the spiritual heart of Temple Beth Zion is strong. May it continue to strengthen.

### Attention TBZ Members! "ShulCloud How-To"

Put the power of your information into your own hands! With the TBZ ShulCloud Member Portal URL (web address) changing on July 1<sup>st</sup>, now is the perfect time to remind our members of how useful and convenient it is to use their TBZ ShulCloud account.

Some of you may think you don't have a ShulCloud account. All our members have ShulCloud accounts – even if they've never tried to use them. Let's see if we can change that!

Accessing your ShulCloud account is as easy as having an email address. The following steps will guide you through the login process and explain how ShulCloud gives you the power to view or make changes to your membership, family, and account information:

#### Step One: Getting to Your Member Account Area

On your computer, tablet, or smart phone, type in [tbzbuffalo.shulcloud.com/member](http://tbzbuffalo.shulcloud.com/member)

A. If your email and password appear automatically, you're in luck! Click "Log In" and you will be redirected to your Member Account Area. (Go to Step 2.)

B. If only your email appears, click "Forgot Password". If ShulCloud recognizes your email, it will allow you to request a new password. You will soon be able to log in and access your Member Account Area. (Go to Step 2.)

C. If no email and no password appear, you may be in ShulCloud under a different email. Please try again. If necessary, click "Forgot Password" as in B. above.

D. If none of these options work, please don't hesitate to contact me for assistance. I am here to help you navigate this process.

#### Step 2: Learning Your Way Around

Once you've accessed your Member Account Area, you will see that it contains four sections:

My Personal and Family Information, My Financial Information, Mail Subscriptions, and My Events. Each of these sections includes clickable "tiles" which you can use to complete or change the information already entered.

#### A. My Personal and Family Information

1. **My Profile** lets you check your personal information. Typos happen. Make sure we have your name spelled correctly, and that your current phone number is accurate.

2. **Change My Password** lets you change your password whenever you need to.

3. **My Family** is where you should make sure your list of family members is complete and correct. If your young children aren't included in your account, you might miss out on special events designed for our families with young children. Don't let this happen! By updating your information, you're not just helping us -- you are making sure you receive updates and invitations relevant to your family.

4. **My Addresses** lets us know where to send your mail.

5. **My Yahrzeits** is a place to record these important details regarding those you have loved and lost.

6. **Edit My Directory Listing** lets you control which information is or isn't shared with other members of TBZ in the Member Directory.

7. **The Member Directory** is the electronic version of those printed Temple Directories! But this one only includes the information our members wish to share, and it updates itself so it is never out-of-date. It is only accessible by other TBZ members. Your information is safe with us.

#### B. My Financial Information

**My Transactions, My Payment Methods, My Recurring Payments, Pay My Bill, and My Statements** allow you to see your recent charges and payments, set up your preferred payment methods (including eChecks and credit cards), and view your current statement. You can make donations and pay your bill online.

C. **My Subscriptions** lets you manage which types of mailings you prefer to receive from us via email or by paper mail.

D. **My Events** lets you see the list of events you've registered for. You can even click on the event listing to remind yourself when and where things are happening.

So, please go ahead and give ShulCloud a try! I am here to help if you get stuck.

TBZ members and non-members of all ages (12+) and all genders are welcome!

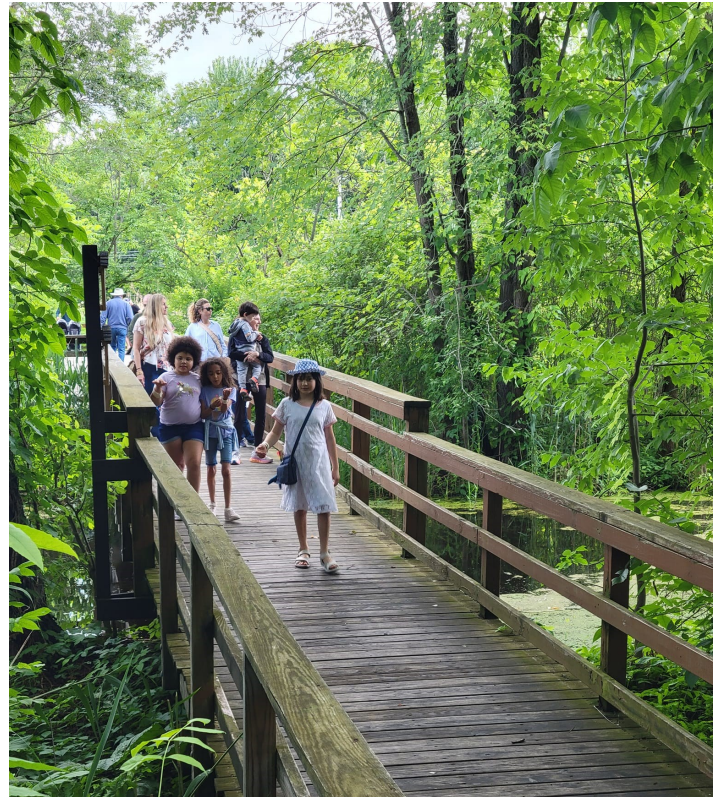

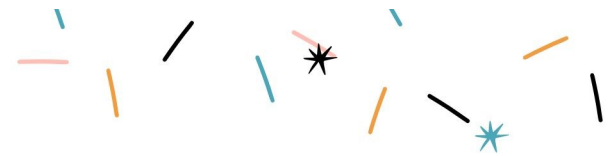
